**A. Qualifying Examination / Eligibility Criteria:**

1. SSC from Maharashtra State Board of Secondary Education.
2. CBSE/ICSE/ and equivalent examination from any other board.

**B. Categories of Admissions:**

1. Online Admission (as per Government Procedure).
2. Minority quota (Students belonging to Telugu Community) and In-house quota (Students passing from A.E.S. High School).
3. Management quota.

**C. Documents Required for the Admission:**

1. Photocopy of Government Online Registration Form Part-1 & Part-2.
2. Print of Admission form (filled online at college website).
3. X Standard Original Mark sheet and 2 attested photocopies of the same.
4. X Standard Original Leaving Certificate and 2 attested photocopies of the same.
5. Photocopy of Aadhaar card.
6. 2 recent passport size photographs each, of the student and both parents.
7. Students seeking admission under SPORTS/CULTURAL/ANY OTHER RESERVATION CATEGORY should submit attested photocopies of the Certificates.
8. **For students passing from ICSE/CBSE/OTHER BOARDS:**  
Eligibility Certificate: a. A duly filled form for eligibility (available at the HSC board Office, Vashi). b. An attested copy of Mark sheet, Passing Certificate. c. Original Migration Certificate. d. Original and attested photocopy of School Leaving Certificate countersigned by education inspector/ Education officer, before securing admission to FYJC. e. The deed of undertaking on stamp paper of rupees 100 signed by the student and parent/Guardian.

**D. General Instructions:**

1. Submission and acceptance of the form does not assure admission.
2. Only one person will be allowed to enter the college premises for form submission.
3. Admission form will only be accepted if all required particulars and documents are properly filled and attached.
4. Details in the admission form should be filled in block letters.
5. Birth date, birthplace, religion, and caste should match those in the school leaving certificate.
6. Failure to pay fees on the specified date will result in loss of admission.

## COLLEGE DISCIPLINE AND CODE OF CONDUCT

All students of the College are expected to adhere strictly to the following rules and regulations:

Science students absent from lectures risk being barred from practicals. Attendance is taken per lecture period; missing one lecture for any reason affects attendance for the entire day. A minimum of 75% attendance per term is required to qualify for final examinations.

### 3. Respect for College Property:

- o Students are responsible for the care and preservation of college property. Any damage incurred must be compensated for by the responsible student.

### 4. Maintaining College Premises:

- o Students must keep the college premises clean and tidy. Defacing walls, doors, or furniture is strictly prohibited.

### 5. Disciplinary Conduct:

- o Loitering in corridors or near the canteen during lecture hours is not allowed. Proper decorum and respect for fellow students and faculty are expected at all times.

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## **6. Behavioral Expectations:**

- o Students are prohibited from engaging in political activities or any behavior that undermines the college's interests or reputation.

## **7. Dress Code and Appearance:**

- o Attire and hairstyles must be appropriate for the college environment. Non-conforming attire may result in restriction from campus until appropriately attired.

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## COLLEGE DISCIPLINE AND REGULATIONS

- Promotion to Std XII is subject to compliance with Maharashtra government regulations.

### **COUNSELLING**

- Professional counseling services are available to assist students with academic stress and personal challenges.

### **GENERAL (OFFICE / ADMINISTRATION)**

- Facilities such as railway and bus concessions are available to eligible students. Bonafide certificates and information on scholarships and free ships can be obtained from the college.
